### JCPL is Getting an Upgrade

The Organization of Watauga Libraries (OWL), which includes Johnson City Public Library (JCPL), has changing its catalog and circulation system to TLC, The Library Corporation's (TLC) Library Solution Software. The new system became available to library users on Wednesday, March 2. JCPL Director and OWL President, Julia Turpin says, "We are all excited to offer this new catalog. TLC is more modern, streamlined, and easier to navigate than our current system. Not only is it simpler for staff, but it also provides a higher quality experience for our users." TLC's catalog system is mobile-friendly and includes new interactive features for users. For example, people can add subject and genre tags to materials to help others find them. TLC also offers automatically generated recommendations related to the titles that users view. Library users will not need to get new library cards when the switch to TLC is made. All current holds, including holds on digital materials, will automatically transfer to the new system.

## **Exciting Library Programs!**

Lisa Krekelberg, Adult Services Manager, shared news of a full agenda of enriching programs being offered at the Johnson City Public Library. A brief sampler of activities includes the Seekers Book Club, a collaboration of the Library with the neighboring Langston Centre, for book discussions featuring classic and modern classic works by African American authors. Also in progress are Community Conversations, to give people a chance to listen to and learn from others about topics of interest to members of our community, with the upcoming March conversations on the topic of Freedom to Read. A Tech Take-Apart Workshop for patrons of all ages will be conducted in late March. This is a fun and educational STEM event to deconstruct old technology and learn about how it works.

There will be several happenings to celebrate Poetry Month in April, such as a Reading Event, featuring area poets Jesse Graves, Lacy Snapp and Isabel Gomez Sobrino reading from their recent releases. There will also be a Bring Your Own Book poetry sharing occasion at the new Johnson City Brewing location in Boones Creek.

The theme for the 2022 Summer Reading programs is Oceans of Possibilities, including a One Book, One Community read of Daniel Wallace's book Big Fish. Details will be released soon! #### The Women of Chateau LaFayette


Stephanie Day (2021)

#### You Never Forget Your First

Alexis Coe (2020)

Despite its catchy title this is actually a short but enlightening biography of George Washington. Coe, with degrees in history and experience as a research curator, has done her homework and presents the story of Washington in new and interesting ways. Readers should find themselves with a deeper understanding of the real man behind the myth.
