

Summer Reading is an annual nationwide reading challenge that libraries have held every year since the 1890s. It was originally started by librarians as a way to keep kids reading and learning during the summer months.

Over the years, Summer Reading has grown and evolved to be for all ages. Our program is divided by age: preschool, school age, teens, and adults. The purpose remains the same though—keep people reading. No matter what age you are, we hope you'll spend the summer reading with your Library!

This year's Summer Reading runs from Monday, June 3-Sunday, July 28. You'll find opportunities for fun and learning at your Library all summer long, from events to prizes to book recommendations.

Participating in Summer Reading is fun, easy, and can be done from anywhere! You spend the summer reading, tracking your progress, winning prizes, and attending events.

You can register for Summer Reading beginning Wednesday, May 15.



To get started, scan the QR code or visit jcpltn.beanstack.org. You'll create an account with Beanstack, our reading challenge platform. From there you can register for the 2024 Summer Reading Challenge. If you've used Beanstack before, just **Beanstack** sign in with your existing account to register for this summer.

Once Summer Reading officially kicks off on June 3, you'll use Beanstack all summer to log your reading progress, get book recommendations, and write book reviews. You'll earn badges as you meet your reading goals and complete related activities!


